Santa wakes up on Christmas Eve day with a cold. Mrs Claus jumps into action and says she will deliver all the gifts for the children. With help from the elves and Santa's reindeer Mrs. Claus is off! The job is a little more complicated than she thought, but she solves problems along the way and returns to the North Pole with ten minutes to spare.



***Five More Sleeps Until Christmas* by Jimmy Fallon**

A little boy is so excited for Christmas he is counting how many more "sleeps" until the big day. As he counts he also shares all the preparations that are happening as he anxiously waits for Santa to come. Big, colorful illustrations and a catchy rhyme make this book a joy to read-aloud.



***A Merry Moosey Christmas* by Lynn Plourde**

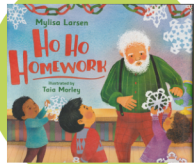
Rudolph wants Christmas Eve off for a change. He and Santa look for someone to replace him. They consider several different animals then choose Moose to lead the sleigh. It takes a lot of training and extra gear, but Moose is ready to go on Christmas Eve!



***Dasher* by Matt Tavares**

This story is about how a reindeer named Dasher escaped from a traveling circus. She meets Santa who is pulling his sleigh full of toys with one horse. Dasher offers to help. She has never done anything so thrilling, but she misses her family. Dasher and Santa rescue Dasher's family from the circus and they become Santa's team of eight reindeer and live happily ever after at the North Pole.

***Ho Ho Homework* by Mylisa Larsen**

It's December and Jack's school class has a sub named Mr. Clausen. He looks a lot like Santa! Could it be? Mr. Clausen teaches the class to make paper snowflake wishes. The end of the book shows you how to make your own paper snowflakes.



***Finding Christmas* by Lezlie Evans**

Hare, Mouse and Squirrel are busy in their burrow getting ready for Christmas. When Mouse goes out to look for a gift for Hare she finds a sick swallow in the snow. The three friends bring Swallow home and try to help her get better. Soon they have used the gifts they made for each other to help Swallow heal. They all enjoy a cozy Christmas filled with friendship and love.



***Bear Stays Up For Christmas* by Karma Wilson**

Bear's friends don't want him to miss Christmas this year. They help him stay awake by having him help find a Christmas tree, bake treats, hang up stockings etc. Bear enjoys making gifts for his friends while they nap. He even gets a surprise visit from Santa. Look for other delightful "Bear" stories by this author.



***Last Stop On The Reindeer Express* by Maudie Powell-Tuck**

This book is filled with beautiful illustrations, doors that open and peek through holes. It tells the story of Mia and how she finds a magic door to a mailbox. It leads her to a magic reindeer that magically takes her the long distance to her grandfather so she can give him the Christmas card she made for him.

***Little Red Sleigh* by Erin Guendelsberger**

The little red sleigh longs to become Santa's big red sleigh so she decides to take a journey and try to find the North Pole and Santa. She doesn't meet Santa, but she finds the love of a little girl and learns the joy of making others happy.



***The Christmas Owl* by Ellen Kallish and Gideon Sterer**

This is a charming story about the little owl that lived in the tree that was cut down in 2020 and delivered to the Rockefeller Center in NYC for Christmas. It is co-written by Ellen Kalish who was the caretaker that helped Rocky return to better health and return to the wild. It is a story of friendship, compassion and finding the true meaning of this special time of year. Based on a true story.



***The Most Wonderful Gift In The World* by Mark Sperring**

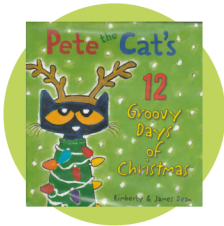
Esme and Bear wake up on Christmas morning and discover a gift under the tree that's not for either of them. The tag says, "For Little Bunny Boo-Boo. love, Santa". They decide they need to find Little Bunny Boo-Boo and deliver the gift even though the snow is high and the wind is strong.



***The Tree That's Meant To Be* by Yuval Zommer**

A little fir tree believes he is too small and imperfect to be chosen by a family for their Christmas Tree. With all the trees around him cut down he is lonely until the animals in the forest find him. They fill his branches with feathers, berries and leaves until he is a festive Christmas tree.

Our grandkids love this book with a crazy twist on the traditional song. They like it even better when grandpa reads it to them!



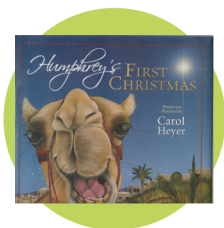
***There Was No Snow On Christmas Eve* by Pamela Munoz Ryan**

There was no snow on the first Christmas Eve. Instead, a dry wind blew. This a beautiful retelling of the familiar nativity story with soft pastel illustrations. It is a gentle reminder of the true meaning of Christmas.



***Mortimer's Christmas Manger* by Karma Wilson**

Mortimer thinks he has found the perfect little house. He has to climb a tree with lights to get to it and move the little people statues so there is room for him to sleep in it. Then he hears one of the big people tell the story of the first Christmas and the manger. Mortimer's heart is touched. Now he understands his house is the stable for baby Jesus and he carefully places the little pieces back in the stable.



***Humphrey's First Christmas* by Carol Heyer**

This is the story of Humphrey, one of the camels that traveled with the three wise men to Bethlehem. Humphrey forgets the hardships of traveling so far when he meets the baby born in a humble stable. This story is a good reminder of the importance of giving and the spirit of Christmas.

Winter Books



***A Loud Winter's Nap* by Katy Hudson**

Tortoise is trying to find a quiet place to hibernate for the winter. Just as he settles in to sleep one of his animal friends invites him to join them in a winter activity. Tortoise hates winter and the cold. When he finally finds a quiet place to sleep, his bed, which is a sled, starts to slide down the mountain. He finds he likes the fast ride down the mountain. Maybe winter isn't that bad.



***The Mitten* by Jan Brett**

Nicki goes out to play in the snow and drops one of the white mittens his grandmother knit for him. Soon different woodland animals find it one by one and crawl inside to stay warm. The knitting holds tight and the mitten grows bigger and bigger to accommodate all the animals. Jan Brett's illustrations are always delightful with the border illustrations telling a story inside the story.



***Over And Under The Snow* by Kate Messner (series)**

A father and his child cross country ski through a forest. They discover and discuss the birds and animals they see and the secret kingdom of animals under the snow. A beautiful nature book that even young children will enjoy. The author gives more details about the animals at the end for those that want to learn more.

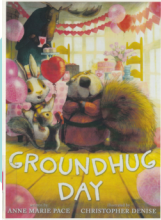


***Learning To Ski With Mr. Magee* by Chris Van Dusen**

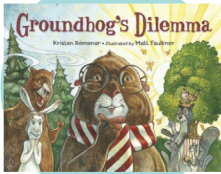


Groundhog's Day Books



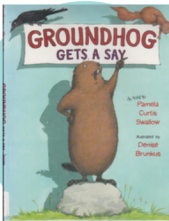
***Groundhog Day* by Anne Marie Pace**

Valentine's Day Books



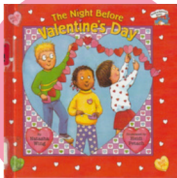
***Love, Ruby Valentine* by Laurie Friedman**

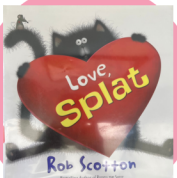
***Ruby Valentine Saves the Day* by Laurie Friedman**

***The Night Before Valentine's Day* by Natasha Wing**

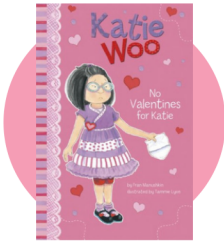
A fun rhyming story that tells all the preparations children make the night before Valentine's Day and their school class party.



***Love, Splat* by Rob Scotton**

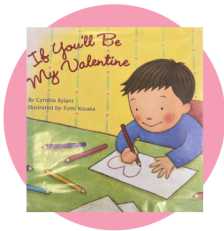

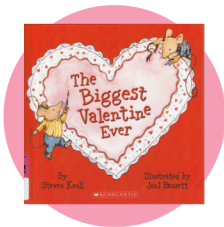
***Katie Woo: No Valentines For Katie* by Fran Manushkin**

***Valentine's Day* by Anne Rockwell**

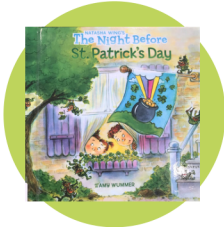
The children in Mrs. Madoff's class prepare Valentine cards that they mail to their friend Michiko who now lives in Japan.

***The Night Before St. Patrick's Day* by Natasha Wing**

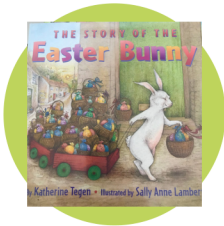

***The Luckiest Leprechaun* by Justine Korman**

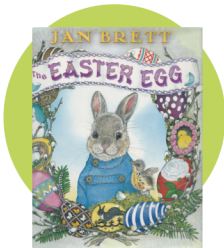

***The Easter Egg* by Jan Brett**

Hoppi wants to win the contest for the best decorated Easter Egg. When he is out gathering ideas and supplies to decorate his egg he finds a robin's egg on the ground. Mother Robin can't keep it warm and take care of the other two in the nest. Hopi helps Mother Robin and doesn't have time to decorate an egg. The Easter Bunny recognizes Hopi for his good deed!



***Bunny Bus* by Ammi-Joan Paquette**

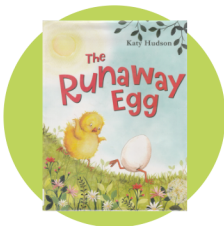

***Bunny's Big Surprise* by Phyllis Limbacher Tildes**

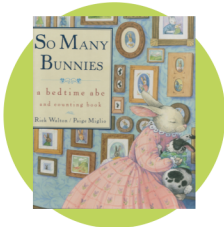

***The Runaway Egg* by Katy Hudson**

After a chase he gets the egg back to the nest before Mama Hen returns.



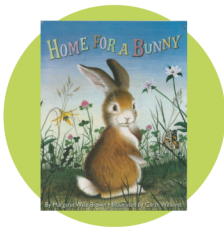
***So Many Bunnies* by Rick Walton**

They all go to sleep in a variety of places and finally Mother Rabbit has a little peace. The illustrations in this book could not be cuter and the rhyming text is very pleasing for young children to listen to.



***The Bunnies Trip* by Lezlie Evans**

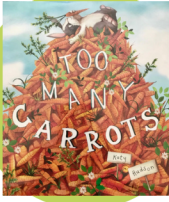

***A Home for A Rabbit* by Margaret Wise Brown**

It's Spring and a bunny is looking for a home of his own. He visits a variety of animals and asks them where their home is. He keeps looking until he meets another bunny. His new bunny friend invites him to share her burrow. This book, written in 1956, is a classic and one my grandchildren have asked for over and over.

***Too Many Carrots* by Katy Hudson**

Rabbit loves carrots! He loves them so much they fill up his house and he doesn't have room to sleep. His animal friends take turns inviting him to stay at their house. When he accepts their offers and brings all his carrots and tries to fit them in their houses, disaster happens. Rabbit realizes that it's best to share his carrots, not just collect and store carrots.



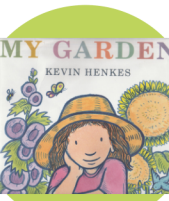
***Grab That Rabbit* by Polly Faber**

Mrs Sprat is not happy that a rabbit has eaten all her carrots. When Mrs Sprat tries to catch him a hawk grabs him first. He's too heavy for the hawk who drops him right by Mrs Sprat. She decides to have rabbit stew for dinner. As she carries the rabbit into the house she feels how soft and fluffy he is. She decides she doesn't want rabbit stew after all and they both live very happily together.



***Muncha, Muncha, Muncha* by Candace Fleming**

Mr McGreely has worked hard planting and caring for his garden. He can't wait to harvest and eat his carrots, lettuce, peas and tomatoes. Three hungry bunnies are also eager to eat the veggie in his garden. This humorous story has lots of repeating phrases that kids love to join in saying-especially "Muncha, Muncha, Muncha"!



***My Garden* by Kevin Henkes**

A little girl helps in her mother's garden, but in her imagination she creates a garden full of magic. In her garden she would plant jelly beans that would grow a jelly bean bush and sea shells that would grow more seashells. All the rabbits would be chocolate. There would be no weeds and the flowers would never die. This book is a good one to start a discussion with the question: What would you plant in your magic garden?

***I Pledge Allegiance To The Flag* by Pat Mora**

A charming true story about the author's aunt who was born in Mexico and as a young girl immigrated to the United States. When she was in her seventies she became a citizen of the United States. Libby and her aunt learn the Pledge of Allegiance together as her aunt prepares to become a citizen.



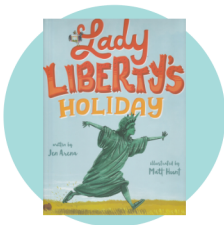
***The Flag We Love* by Pamela Munoz Ryan**

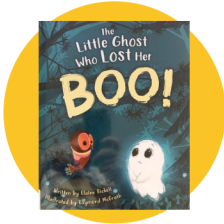
***Lady Liberty's Holiday* by Jen Arena**

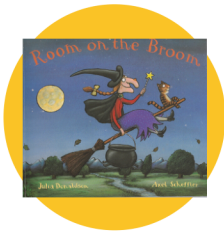

***How To Scare A Ghost* by Jean Reagan**

All of the books in this series are delightful! You learn how to find a ghost, scare a ghost and what to play with your ghost. At the end the kids go trick-or-treating with the ghost.



***Snowmen At Halloween* by Carolyn Buehner**

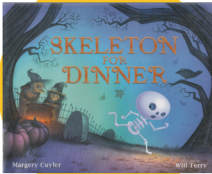

Halloween Books



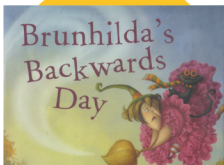
***Gustavo The Shy Ghost* by Flavia Z. Drago**

Gustavo is good at doing lots of things, but he's shy and has a hard time making friends with the other monsters. Gustavo loves to play his violin and finds a way to use this talent to help him meet others and make friends.



***Skeleton For Dinner* by Margery Cutler**

Big Witch and Little Witch make a big pot of stew and want to invite their friends for dinner. Skeleton misreads the invitation and thinks the witches want to eat him, Ghost and Ghoul for dinner. A crow helps clear up the confusion and they all enjoy dinner together.



***Brunhilda's Backwards Day* by Shawna J. C. Tenney**

Brunhilda the witch loves making trouble. One day she wakes up on the right side of the bed instead of the wrong side and everything is backwards. Instead of causing mischief her spells bring joy and happiness. This clever story is full of bright, bold illustrations that make the story even better.



***The Monsters' Monster* by Patrick McDonnell**

Once upon a time three bad, little monsters create a big monster who they think will be the biggest, baddest monster ever. The new monster doesn't turn out like they planned. He's polite and nice. They don't know what to do at first, but they soon learn to smile and change their habits.

***Creepy Carrots!* by Aaron Reynolds**

Jasper Rabbit loves carrots, especially the carrots from Crackenhopper Field. Jasper stops there often and eats as many as he can. Then his imagination gets the better of him. He thinks the creepy carrots are following him home. This isn't a Halloween book, but the orange, black and gray illustrations along with the "creepiness" theme make this humorous book a great read-aloud during the month of October.



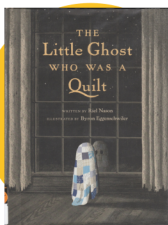
***The Halloween Tree* by Susan Montanari**

A young sapling doesn't want to be a Christmas Tree like the trees surrounding him. Eventually he grows into a gnarly old tree. The children in the neighborhood love the old tree. He becomes their fort, spaceship and even a dragon as they play. Then the children decide to decorate the tree for Halloween and a new tradition is born.



***Big Pumpkin* by Erica Silverman**

A witch grew a huge pumpkin! It was so big she couldn't get it off the vine to make a pumpkin pie. Her friends, the ghost, vampire and mummy, try to help, but they don't succeed. Then a little bat comes along with an idea of how they can all work together to pick the pumpkin. In the end they are all rewarded with homemade pumpkin pie!



***The Little Ghost Who Was A Quilt* by Riel Nason**

Ghosts are supposed to be sheets that are light as air and can float through the air. Little ghost, who is a quilt, feels different. His family and friends are sheets. He feels sad and left out, but all of that changes on Halloween. Little ghost is able to keep a little girl warm and it feels good. His family and friends admire his courage and little ghost is so happy he floats without even trying.

***It's Halloween Little Monster* by Helen Ketteman**

This is one of the cutest monster books you will find. I love the illustrations! Little monster is going trick-or-treating with his father for the very first time. They see all kinds of creatures and hear some scary noises too, but his papa is near so there is nothing to fear. Little monster laughs when papa is startled and screams!



***The Little Kitten* by Nicola Killen**

When Ollie and her cat, Pumpkin, were out playing in the fall leaves they found a shivering little kitten. Ollie gets lost in the woods when she tries to find where the kitten's home is. Pumpkin rescues her and helps her find her way home. They are both surprised when they discover who the little kitten belongs to. A charming, delightful story!



***Stumpkin* by Lucy Ruth Cummins**

This book will change how you feel about pumpkins that don't have a stem. Stumpkin wants to be a jack-o-lantern in someone's home. The other pumpkins at the shop get chosen one by one and leave the stand. Stumpkin is almost perfect! Why doesn't anyone take him home? Then he realizes he has a home and that makes him very happy!



***Grimelda, the Very Messy Witch* by Diana Murray**

When Grimelda wants to make Pickle Pie she can't find the main ingredient. She can't find her spell book either so she has to clean her house. The problem is her house just doesn't feel right after she cleans and organizes. A fun rhyming tale.

Fall Books



***Pumpkin Soup* by Helen Cooper**

Cat, Squirrel and Duck live together in a cabin in the woods. They enjoy making pumpkin soup together the same way every day. One day Duck suggests a different plan and there is a squabble. The three friends have to learn what's really important and how to solve their differences. There is a recipe for Pumpkin Soup at the end.



***Sneeze, Big Bear, Sneeze* by Maureen Wright**

Big bear thinks his sneezes are causing the leaves and apples to fall off trees and the geese to fly away. The autumn breeze tries to show him otherwise.



***The Leaf Thief* by Alice Hemming**

Squirrel is distressed when the leaves change colors and start to fall off his tree. He wants to know who the leaf thief is. The other animals try to teach him about the fall wind and trees that lose their leaves. More details are given at the end about changes that happen in autumn.



***Lawrence In The Fall* by Matthew Farina**

Lawrence's teacher announces to her class that they are to bring something they collect for show and tell. Lawrence doesn't know what to bring. His father suggests they take a walk in the woods and look for ideas. Lawrence discovers a variety of leaves in beautiful fall colors that he collects and shares with his class.

***The Night Before Thanksgiving* by Natasha Wing**

A fun story of how a family prepares for Thanksgiving by baking, welcoming relatives, putting on a skit, playing games then ultimately eating the golden turkey!



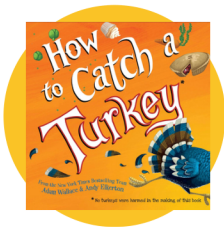
***Thanksgiving Rules* by Laurie Friedman**
